

Kenya 2010 Info & Itinerary

Please be aware that depending on circumstances, the itinerary may change once in Kenya. Being flexible is the best way to be in Africa, everything doesn't always go to plan.

Approximately 15 (fifteen) people have expressed interest in travelling and we are flying Doctor Jane out from Thailand, to be with us as well.

We will be flying Emirates Airlines. The benefits with this airline are a larger baggage allowance, direct flights from Melbourne to Dubai and ticketing is from Tasmania. This means, we put our bags on in Tasmania and we don't have to worry about them till Kenya.

After I have received deposits, I will book all the flights and then email out flight itineraries, with exact flight times.

We are hoping to take the children from the Nairobi School on field trips to Nairobi National Park, Museum and Baby Elephant Park, whilst in Nairobi. Days off will be staggered throughout our time in Nairobi. Small teams may travel to Arusha and Nakuru.

Visas - \$50 US dollars for Kenyan Visa

Those travelling to Tanzania will need another \$50 US dollars for Tanzanian visa

US dollars can be bought in Kenya if needed

Travel Insurance – You must have travel Insurance

I can arrange travel Insurance through Christian Outreach Centre. If you desire this option, please email me your Full Name (as on your passport), Date Of Birth, and any on-going health issues.

You can also arrange your own (please be aware that some credit card have Travel Insurance, as part of their offers – worth checking)

Donations – You will be visiting churches during your stay, so please make sure to carry some money to give as a donation. It is up to you what you give, anything no matter what size will be appreciated. Giving to beggars is a difficult area. Some people are professional beggars, who pay a percentage of their earnings to bosses. My personal rule of thumb is, if I can see that the person is physically unable to work, I give a small donation. Feel free to consult with anybody who has previously been.

Food – Generally food costs run at about \$7 dollars a day. Everyone chips in and we have shopping trips to buy food from local markets. When we are at Bala and Arusha, we give a group donation to cover the costs of catering for us, so as we are a blessing not a burden. Carnivore's restaurant in Nairobi is approximately \$30 ahead for a very large meal and a great experience.
